Concussion Procedures

The SCHSHL believes that player safety is of paramount importance. As a result we have developed the following protocols in regards to head injuries.

Dr. Sal Trazzera is the coordinating physician for the SCHSHL's concussion baseline program. Below is a list of procedures you <u>MUST</u> follow should your child suffer a concussion/ head injury. Please note that your child may use any physician that has access to the "ImPACT's Concussion Assessment testing system" when being evaluated in an effort to return to play after having suffered a concussion.

Your son/daughter has sustained a head injury and <u>MUST</u> complete the following before being allowed to play in a SCHSHL hockey game:

- 1. Your child needs to be seen by a doctor and cleared to play.
- The doctor must provide you with a prescriptive note or clearance note on letterhead and must sign the pink injury sheet given to you when your child was hurt.
 <u>BOTH</u> OF THESE <u>MUST</u> be returned to either a SCHSHL official or the SCHSHL trainer.
- **3.** Your child took an ImPACT's Concussion Assessment Baseline test before the start of the season. Your child **MUST** retake and pass the baseline test.
- 4. A Copy of the completed baseline test <u>MUST</u> be returned to to either a SCHSHL official or the SCHSHL trainer.
